

## SYLVANIA TOWNSHIP INVITATION TO BID

The Sylvania Township Board of Trustees is seeking bids for the:  
**Annual Household Pick Up 2023-2025.**

### 1.0 LEGAL FRAMEWORK

This Invitation to Bid (ITB) is issued under the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 9.312. All bids submitted in response to this ITB shall comply with Ohio law. The laws of the State of Ohio will govern any disputes arising under this ITB and subsequent contract.

#### 1.1 Description of Project

Sylvania Township Annual Household Pick Up Service for calendar years 2023, 2024 & 2025

### 2.0 BID SUBMITTAL PROCESS

Any bidder submitting a bid must submit a completed bid form following the procedure outlined in this Invitation to Bid (ITB) no later than **10:00 a.m., October 25, 2022**. All of the sections applicable in the Invitation to Bid shall be read so as to give meaning to all such provisions. However, when there is a conflict in the interpretation between a specification in the Invitation to Bid and sections, the specification in the Invitation to Bid shall take precedence.

The bid opening is scheduled for **10:00 a.m., October 25, 2022**. All sealed bids received after this time and date, for any reason, will be rejected. The opening of the sealed bids will take place at the Sylvania Township Hall, 4927 Holland-Sylvania Road, Sylvania, Ohio 43560. Sylvania Township reserves the right to postpone the bid opening for its convenience.

Each bid shall be submitted in a sealed container or envelope, with the project title "**Household Pick Up**" clearly marked on the outside of the package. All bids must be mailed or hand delivered to:

The entire set of ITB documents must be returned intact and in the following order:

- a. Bid Proposal; this includes any amendments applicable to this ITB.
- b. Completed Affidavits: (1) Delinquent Property Tax, (2) Non-Discrimination, (3) No Findings for Recovery (4) Non-Collusion/Conflict of Interest
- c. Bonding as required under Section 7.4.

Faxed or emailed transmissions of bid are unacceptable. Sealed bids received through the mail after the specified date and time will be returned.

## 2.1 Inquiries

Any prospective bidder desiring an explanation or interpretation of the ITB or specifications must request it in writing or email soon enough to allow a reply to reach all prospective bidders before the submission of their bids but no later than 5 (five) business days prior to the bid opening.

## 2.2 Modifications/Amendments/Supplements

No alterations, additions (alternate bids), deletions, or exceptions to the specifications contained herein are permitted except by amendments issued by the Township to all bidders that have received an ITB. Oral explanations or instructions given before the award of a contract will not be binding.

Amendments will be included in the scope of work and will become a part of contract documents. Amendments may be issued up to seventy-two (72) hours preceding the bid opening date, excluding weekends and holidays.

Once opened, bids may not be altered. Each response in regard to this ITB shall be completed, self-contained and meet the requirements of the ITB. The Township may initiate clarifications after the bid opening. However, these clarifications will not constitute an alteration of the bid submitted.

## **3.0 SPECIFICATIONS**

### 3.1 Scope of Services

SERVICE AND LABOR: Contractor will provide, furnish, and perform all work necessary and proper for or incidental to the **Annual Household Pick Up and Provide One (1) 30 Cubic Yard Roll Off Dumpster** delivered to the Road Department Facility as specified for Sylvania Township, Ohio per year for a three year period.

Crews will provide one (1) pass through the community per year beginning the first **Monday following Labor Day**. To avoid being missed, the Road Superintendent requires all items placed at the curb or edge of the road by 5:00 AM, the Monday after Labor Day. This service is available to Township residents only.

This service is limited to the following items:

House hold appliances, furniture, bundled books and magazines, empty 55 gallon drums, toys, bikes, empty containers, carpeting rolled no longer than 5 feet in length, mattresses and bed springs, and small loose material that is placed in some type of disposal container, other than plastic bags. **Hazardous material, tires and large piles of construction material is NOT provided with this service.**

DISTRICTS: Sylvania Township will provide a "district map route" showing the start and finish areas, #1 through #23, which the contractor will work in each district. See attached map.

TIME: This General Collection and Disposal shall start each year the **Monday, following Labor Day**, work to be completed within five (5) working days, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Saturday collection may be authorized upon request at the Township's discretion.

PLACE OF COLLECTION: General Clean-Up Refuse Collection shall include all homes, apartments, condominiums, and other dwelling units. The residents are to place the material to be picked up near the curb or near the pavement edge in public streets without curbs.

LOAD RECORDS: Contractor shall furnish tickets verifying the number of tons collected and disposed. A ticket must be furnished for each load and shall show the truck number (#) and license plate number of the truck, number of tons, date and where unloaded. **Tickets shall be turned into the Sylvania Township Road Superintendent** at the end of the pick-up along with an invoice.

ROLL OFF DUMPSTER: The Contractor shall provide one (1) 30 cubic yard roll of dumpster per year for household waste related material at the Road Department facility, 4927 Holland Sylvania Road, invoiced per ton, and provide unloading cycles during the scheduled pickup period plus 10 days thereafter.

MISCELLANEOUS: The Contractor shall provide a cell phone number of a primary contact or foreman that is aware of each crews location to the Road Superintendent. Cell phones shall provide communication between Township Representatives and Contractor's crew performing the Pick-Up. Contractor shall provide the Township daily updates regarding progress/location.

### 3.2 Terms of Contract

The exact contract commencement date, completion date, and option periods will be set forth in the contract and resolution approving the contract as adopted by the Township Trustees. The term of this contract will be for **2023, 2024 and 2025**.

### 3.3 Requirements of the Contractor

The bidder must agree to comply with all applicable Federal, state, and local laws in the conduct of the work specified in this ITB including applicable state and Federal laws regarding drug-free work places. The bidder will be required to accept full responsibility for payment of all taxes and insurance premiums including, but not limited to, Unemployment Compensation premiums, Workers' Compensation, all income tax deductions, Social Security deductions, and any other taxes or payroll deductions required for all employees engaged by the bidder in the performance of the work specified in this ITB.

### 3.4 Assignments/Subcontractors

The contract will be made pursuant to the bid submitted by the bidder. The contract will be based on the bidder's qualifications and responsibilities. The bidder will not sublet or assign the contract nor shall any subcontractor commence performance of any part of the work included in the resulting contract, without the previous written consent of Sylvania Township.

### 3.5 Compensation/Invoices

The bidder will be required to submit invoices to the address below. The bidder's Federal Tax Identification Number should appear on all statements and invoices. Sylvania Township does not assume any late payment penalties. No condition will alter this statement.

### 3.6 Taxes

Sylvania Township does not pay local, state or Federal taxes. If requested, the bidder will be furnished with an exemption certificate.

### 3.7 Licenses/Permits

The selected bidder is responsible for obtaining all permits and licenses required for performance of the work specified. All labor and materials provided under this agreement shall meet or exceed minimum standards covered by the current applicable code(s) or bidder shall have obtained a legal waiver.

## **4.0 PROPOSAL/BID FORMAT**

In responding to this IBT, bidders must comply with each of the format requirements detailed in this section.

Bidders are expected to quote firm and fixed prices on a per unit basis in the format provided. The successful bidder will not change the unit price or the scope of work during the contract period or any extension periods, however should the bidder receive a decrease in overall costs associated with the commodity, this provision shall allow for modification of the existing contract to decrease the price.

Bidders must utilize pricing forms supplied in this document. The Township intends to establish a contractual arrangement for specified commodity or services. Any services not specifically named on the pricing pages are to be named, priced and submitted on subsequent pages so long as presented in a manner consistent with supplied format with fixed cost estimates.

There will be no incidental charges for services. If the Township has left any information out of these specifications where the Bidder would foresee additional charges/fees, the bidder must include that information on an additional exception sheet.

### 4.1 Bid Security Requirements

Bidders shall submit with their completed proposal/bid, security in the form of a bond, certified check, cashier's check, or money order in accordance with Section 307.88 and 153.54, et seq. as required in this ITB, Section 7.4.

### 4.2 Forms

Bidders shall complete and submit with their proposal/bid all applicable forms in Section A of this ITB.

### 4.3 Mathematical Error

Bidders are required to submit firm and fixed prices in the format specified on the Bid sheet (**Section B**). When there are errors in multiplication or addition in a bid, the unit price quoted will be used for calculating the correct total bid. If the error is in the unit price, the bid will be automatically disqualified.

#### 4.4 Withdrawal of Bid

Bidders may withdraw their bids at any time prior to the bid opening date. Withdrawal of a bid after a bid opening exposes a bidder to legal liability for sanctions, including costs for re-bid, or may result in a bid being awarded to the next lowest bidder.

### **5.0 EVALUATION OF BIDS**

An award will be made to the bidder who is considered lowest and best bid for the Township's needs.

The Board of Trustees reserves the right to reject all bids, to waive minor technicalities, to amend the original estimate, and to request a re-bid through the bid process without disclosure of a reason. The failure to make such a disclosure will not result in the accrual of any right, claim or cause of action by any unsuccessful bidder against Sylvania Township.

The Board of Trustees reserves the right to conduct site visits of proposed facilities to determine the capability of the bidder to perform.

All bid pricing will be valid for 60 (sixty) calendar days from the bid opening date to permit adequate evaluation of bid responses.

Sylvania Township may make an award as a whole or on a partial basis, based on the individual's bid specifications.

The Board of Township Trustees does not obligate itself to purchase the full quantities indicated and the unit price bid must be effective if purchase is less. Conversely, the Board's requirements may be in excess of the quantities shown and the successful bidder shall be required to furnish all requirements under the specification at the unit price bid for an agreed period of time.

Bidders failing to respond to all requirements specified in this ITB may result in the rejection of the bid.

### **6.0 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION**

The Township Administrator will have overall responsibility for administering the contract but may delegate that responsibility to other Township employees.

#### 6.1 Termination for Default

Sylvania Township may, with or without notice, terminate the contract at any time the Contractor fails to carry out its provision under the terms and conditions of the contract. If the Contractor fails to remedy the conditions, Sylvania Township will issue an order to stop work immediately and terminate the contract without obligation. Such failure shall constitute an event of default on the part of the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to pay damages to the Township to compensate the Township for any damages it incurs as a result of the default. The Contractor agrees that if the Township does not give prompt notice of such a failure, that the Township has not waived any of its rights or remedies concerning the failure by the Contractor.

## 6.2 Non-Acceptance Criteria for Work, Materials, and Service

No certificate of payment, neither provision in the bidding documents, nor any partial shipment of materials or entire occupancy by the Township shall constitute an acceptance of work, materials or service not done or provided in accordance with the contract documents, or relieve the Contractor of liability for any express or implied warranties or responsibility for faulty materials or workmanship. The Contractor shall remedy any defects in the work, material or service and pay for any other resulting damage to other work, material or equipment which appears within one year of final acceptance of the work, materials, or service unless a longer period is elsewhere specified. Nothing stated herein should relieve the Contractor of common law liability for latent defects, which may appear after the expiration of the warranty period.

## **7.0 TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

### 7.1 Independent Contractor

The Contractor shall act in performance of this Contract as an independent contractor. As an independent contractor, the Contractor and/or its officers, officials, board, employees, representatives, agents, volunteers and/or servants are not entitled to any of the benefits enjoyed by employees of Sylvania Township.

### 7.2 Indemnification

The bidder must agree to indemnify, protect, and hold harmless, Sylvania Township against all liabilities, claims, or demands for injuries or damages to any person or property growing out of the performance of this contract, by bidder and/or seller, its servants, employees agents or representatives. Prior to issuance of purchase order, the successful bidder must furnish an Insurance Carrier's Certificate showing that the bidder has adequate workers' compensation, public liability, and property damage insurance coverage in accordance with Section 7.3.

### 7.3 Insurance

The Contractor shall purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect it from claims set forth below which may arise out of or result from the Contractor's execution of the work, whether such execution be by himself or by any subcontractor or by anyone directly employed by any of them, or by any one for whose acts any of them may be liable.

Claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness or disease or death of his employees or of any person other than his employees;

Claims for damages insured by usual personal injury liability coverage which are sustained (1) by any person as a result of an offense directly or indirectly related to the employment of such person by the Contractor, or (2) by any other person; and

Claims for damages because of injury to or destruction of tangible property, including loss of use resulting there from.

A Certificate of Insurance acceptable to the Township shall be filed with the Township prior to commencement of the work naming the Township as additional insured. These Certificates shall contain a provision that coverage afforded under the policies will not be canceled unless at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to the Township.

The Contractor shall procure and maintain, at his own expense, during the Contract Time, liability insurance as hereinafter specified;

Comprehensive General Liability and Property Damage, Contractor's Protective Liability, Contractual Liability, Completed Operations-Products, Automobile Bodily Injury and Property Damage, owned and non-owned and hired vehicles and Owner's Protective Liability. The latter policy shall name as the insured the Owner. If excluded from Contractor's standard coverage, the following shall be deleted for policies provided under the Contract Document Exclusions: (1) "Underground Operations" (2) "Third Party Beneficiary" and (3) "Collapse" – where exposure is determined. Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Insurance shall cover the use of "Explosives" if used in performance of the Contract. Insurance should be placed with a carrier with an AM Best Rating of at least an A-.

The types and **minimum** limits of insurance shall be as follows:

Commercial General Liability Insurance –  
General Aggregate Limit - \$2,000,000  
Products – Completed Operations –

Personal and Advertising  
Injury Limit - \$1,000,000  
Each Occurrence Limit - \$1,000,000  
Comprehensive Automobile Liability  
Bodily Injury & Property Damage Liability Limit  
Each Occurrence - \$1,000,000

The above minimum coverage may be obtained through the primary insurance or any combination of primary and umbrella insurance. In addition, the General Aggregate Limit shall be required on a per project basis.

The Contractor shall acquire and maintain, if applicable, Fire and Extended Coverage Insurance upon the Project to the full insurable value thereof for the benefit of the Owner, the Contractor, and Subcontractors as their interest may appear. This provision shall in no way release the Contractor or Contractor's surety from obligations under the Contract Documents to fully complete the Project.

The Contractor shall procure and maintain at his own expense, during the Contract Time, in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the state in which the work is performed, Workmen's Compensation Insurance, including occupational disease provisions, for all of his employees at the site of the Project and in case any work is sublet, the Contractor shall require such Subcontractor similarly to provide Workmen's Compensation Insurance, including occupational disease provisions for all of the latter's employees unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. In case any class of employees engaged in hazardous work under this contract at the site of the Project is not protected under Workmen's Compensation statute, the Contractor shall provide, and shall cause such Subcontractor to provide, adequate and suitable insurance for the protection of his employees not otherwise protected.

The Contractor shall secure, if applicable, "All Risk" type Builder's Risk Insurance for Work to be performed. Unless specifically authorized by the Owner, the amount of such insurance shall not be less than the Contract Price totaled in the Bid. The policy shall cover not less than the losses

due to fire, explosion, hail, lightning, vandalism, malicious mischief, wind, collapse, riot, aircraft and smoke during the Contract Time, and until the Work is accepted by the Owner. The policy shall name as the insured the Contractor, and the Owner.

The Contractor expressly understands that the insurance requirements as outlined above are minimum requirements to be met under the contract and does not in any manner represent that the limits, coverage or policy forms are sufficient or adequate to protect the interest or liability of the Contractor and/or its subcontractors

#### 7.4 Bid Security

- a. Each bid must be accompanied by a Bid Guarantee and Contract Bond in the amount of 100% of the bid;

**OR**

- b. A certified check, cashier's check or letter of credit from a solvent bank with the Sylvania Township Board of Trustees identified as the obligee in the amount of 10% of the bid, which will require a 100% Performance Bond upon award of the contract.

10% Bonding (10% x Bidder's Unit Price x 100 tons)

100% Bonding (100% x Bidder's Unit Price x 100 tons)

Upon execution of a contract, the Township shall return the bid guarantees/bonds to all unsuccessful bidders.

#### 7.5 Equal Opportunity Provisions Required

All bidders must be willing to enter a contract containing the express language contained in Section 125.111 of the ORC, which requires the following:

Every contract for or on behalf of the state or any of its political subdivisions for the purchase of materials, equipment, supplies, contract of insurance, or services shall contain provisions similar to those required by Section 153.59 of the Revised Code in the case of construction contracts by which the bidder agrees to both of the following:

That in the hiring of employees for the performance of work under the contract or any subcontract no Contractor or subcontractor shall, by reasons of race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap, national origin or ancestry, discriminate against any citizen of this state in the employment of a person qualified and available to perform the work to which the contract relates.

That no Contractor, subcontractor, or any person acting on behalf of any Contractor or subcontractor shall, in any manner, discriminate against, intimidate, or retaliate against any employee hired for the performance of work under the contract on account of race, color, religion, sex, age, handicap, national origin or ancestry.

All Contractors who contract with the state or any of its political subdivisions for materials, equipment, supplies, contracts of insurance, or services shall have a written affirmative action program for the employment and effective utilization of economically disadvantaged persons, as defined in Section 122.71 of the Revised Code. Annually, each such Contractor shall file a description of the affirmative action program and a progress report on its implementation with the



Ohio Civil Rights Commission and the Minority Business Development Office established under Section 122.92 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### 7.6 Drug Free Workplace

The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable state and federal laws regarding drug-free workplace and shall have established and have in place a drug free workplace policy. The Contractor shall make a good faith effort to ensure that all of its employees will not purchase, use, or possess illegal drugs or abuse prescription drugs in any way.
